COLLECTION REMINDERS







Set waste containers at the curb **by 7 a.m.** on your scheduled collection day, but not earlier than 5 p.m. the night before.

Remove emptied containers and any uncollected waste from the curb by 8 p.m. on collection day.

Do not place waste containers on the roadway or sidewalk or on top of or behind snow banks during the winter.

Garbage tags (sold in quantities of five) and large item tags can be purchased from the following Town facilities:

Yard waste collection is every other week from April to November.


Have a Broken Blue Box or Green Bin?







TEXTILE RECYCLING PROGRAM

The Town of Newmarket's textile recycling program, in partnership with Diabetes Canada, helps support textile diversion in our community. This program accepts all adult and children's clothing and footwear, including undergarments, towels, pillows, and curtains. Accepted items include textiles that are worn, torn or stained.

All donated textiles must be dry and free of any medical or hazardous liquids such as grease, oil, blood and vomit.

By donating your unwanted textiles, you are helping the environment and supporting local charities and their programs.

BLUE BOX COLLECTION







Reminders:

- All containers must be empty and clean before placing in your blue box.
- Maximum weight per blue box is 22 kg (50 lbs).
- Use accepted blue box containers only. Blue boxes must not exceed 22 gallons (83 L) in capacity.
- Oversized containers, containers with attached lids and/or wheels and any type of plastic bag are not accepted containers.
- Flatten and bundle cardboard and place on top of or beside your blue box. Bundles must not exceed 36" x 36" x 8" (90 cm x 90 cm x 20 cm).
- Shredded paper is not accepted in the blue box.
 Small amounts can be placed in your green bin.
 Large amounts are accepted at select York Region waste depots (refer to page 3).



These items DO NOT belong in your blue box:

Plastic bags, plastic overwrap, plastic sleeves from newspapers, polystyrene foam, clothing, furnace filters, toys, paper towels, take-out cups, plastic straws, black plastic and single-use masks and gloves.

Helpful Tips to Reduce Blue Box Litter in your Neighbourhood!

- Place heavier recyclables on top of lighter ones to keep them from blowing away, especially on windy days.
- · Flatten all boxes.
- Place blue boxes at the curb on the morning of collection rather than the night before.
- Make sure items placed in the blue box belong in there.
- Do not place blue boxes on the roadway or on top of snow banks during the winter.
- Use additional blue boxes if necessary to avoid overflow. There is no limit to the number of blue boxes you can place out for weekly collection.
- Consider making a trip to a York Region waste depot to dispose of extra blue box recyclables for free (see page 3).

GREEN BIN COLLECTION







Reminders:

- Remove plastic packaging or overwrap from food before placing food scraps in your kitchen catcher or green bin.
- Material placed in the green bin must be in a securely tied bag.
- Use certified compostable bags to line your green bin or kitchen catcher.
- Maximum weight per green bin is 22 kg (50 lbs).
- Use accepted green bins only (i.e. Town-issued green bins). Green bins must not exceed 12 gallons (45 L) in capacity.

- Cigarette butts
- Coffee pods
- Cotton balls
- Cutlery (plastic, metal, bamboo, compostable)

- Dryer lint
- Dryer sheets
- Elastic bands

- Vacuum bags and contents
- Wax paper
- Wood





YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Reminders:

- Yard waste collection occurs every other week from April to November.
- Place yard waste in Kraft paper bags or open-top garbage containers that have two open, rigid handles and are marked with a yellow "Yard Waste" sticker. Yard waste stickers are available for free at the Newmarket Municipal Offices and Robert N. Shelton Operations Centre.
- Yard waste set out for collection in plastic bags, cardboard boxes, blue boxes, green bins or unmarked containers will not be collected.
- Use twine to bundle branches. Bundled branches must not exceed 4 ft. in length, 2 ft. in diameter or 4" in diameter per branch.
- Maximum weight per container is 22 kg (50 lbs). Includes bundles.

- Corn stalks

Grasscycling

Leaving grass clippings on your lawn after you mow has many benefits. It helps retain moisture in your lawn and supplies the soil with nitrogen, which creates lush, green grass and reduces the need to use fertilizers.



Composting




Composting produces an excellent soil conditioner that will improve your soil and the plants growing within it while at the same time, reducing your kitchen and yard waste. Composting can reduce household waste by as much as 30 per cent.

Composters are available for purchase year-round at the Robert N. Shelton Operations Centre (1275 Maple Hill Court).



FIGHT THE BITE! AGAINST BLACKLEGGED TICKS AND LYME DISEASE

What is Lyme disease?



Lyme disease is caused by a bacteria called Borrelia burgdorferi which is spread through the bite of an infected blacklegged tick.

Symptoms of Lyme disease may include:

- A skin rash
 Fever or chills
 - · Dizziness or confusion
 - Muscle and joint pain
- weaknessHeadache



Swollen lymph nodes

See your health care provider if you develop symptoms of Lyme disease after a tick bite or after visiting a wooded or brushy area.

Protect yourself in wooded or brushy areas

- Wear light-coloured, long-sleeved clothing and closed footwear
- Use insect repellents containing DEET or icaridin
- · Walk in the middle of trails
- · Shower when you get home
- Check yourself, your family and your pets for ticks
- Remove attached ticks as soon as possible



What are blacklegged ticks?



- Ticks are small bugs that feed off the blood of animals and humans
- Adult ticks are the size of a sesame seed and nymphs are the size of a poppy seed
- Ticks are found on tall grasses and bushes in wooded areas
- They can attach and feed up to five days

If you find a tick on you or or a family member remove it quickly



- Grasp the tick with tweezers as close as possible to your skin and pull it straight out
- Do not put anything on the tick or try to burn it off
- Disinfect the area with rubbing alcohol



Recap needle and place into approved sharp container offered free of charge at any participating pharmacy.





Once the sharp waste has reached the designated fill line, snap lid closed by securing the strip.





To permanently close the sharps container, insert the tab into the opening to secure the lid down.



Always use an approved sharps container when disposing of used sharps to help reduce the risk of needlestick injuries.



What is West Nile virus? West Nile virus is spread to humans from the bite of an infected mosquito.


How to protect yourself when outdoors

- Wear light-coloured, long-sleeved shirts and pants
- Use insect repellents containing DEET or icaridin
- Cover up at dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active



How York Region protects you

York Region's West Nile Virus Program includes larviciding over 100,000 catch basins during the summer and using mosquito traps to capture and test for West Nile virus infected mosquitoes.



Mosquito-proof your home

- Clean up areas of standing water around your home
- Ensure door and window screens are tight-fitting and in good repair
- Clean up pools / pool covers
- Turn over wading pools
- · Empty out flower pots
- Clear eavestroughs, storm and roof gutters
- · Clean bird baths weekly
- Empty water in old tires



What is Household Hazardous Waste?



Household hazardous waste (HHW) is anything in your home that is corrosive, explosive, flammable or poisonous and is no longer needed. It should be brought to a HHW depot where it will be disposed of safely.

Examples of HHW:

- Aerosol cans (full or partially full)
- Batteries
- Cleaning products
- Cosmetics
- Fertilizers
- · Fluorescent light bulbs and tubes
- Gasoline (containers may not be returned)
- Glues and adhesives
- Nail polish and polish remover
- · Paints (liquid and solid)

- · Paint thinner and varnish remover
- Perfume and cologne
- Pesticides, insecticides and herbicides
- Pharmaceuticals
- Propane cylinders/tanks
- Pool chemicals
- Sharps (needles/syringes) must be in puncture proof container
- · Used motor oil and filters

Residents can drop off 60L of household hazardous waste and 20 compact fluorescent tubes per household per day.

What is Electronic Waste?



Electronic waste (e-waste) is any electronic equipment in your home that no longer works and cannot be repaired. E-waste should not be thrown in the garbage as these items contain materials considered to be hazardous.

Examples of e-waste:

- Cables
- · Cameras and camcorders
- Cell phones, telephones, pagers and fax machines
- Computer towers, laptops, tablets, modems, keyboards and mice

- Game systems



Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) can clog your pipes and our sewers when poured down the sink, drain or toilet.

Fats, oils and grease include:

butter and margarine, meat fats, salad dressings, cooking oils (including deep frying oils), sauces, gravies, shortening and lard.

Proper Disposal

- Fats, oils and grease should be allowed to cool and harden, then scraped into the green bin
- Use a small amount of paper towel to help wipe and absorb the liquid before placing it in your green bin
- Liquid cooking oil can also be dropped off at a York Region waste depot to be recycled



GARBAGE COLLECTION

- A maximum of three bags or containers of garbage will be collected bi-weekly.
- Additional garbage bags or containers, up to a maximum of three, must have a Town of Newmarket garbage tag affixed.
 Place tag around the neck of the bag or on the uppermost article inside the container. Tags must be visible.
- Garbage tags are available for purchase from locations listed on page 1.
- Garbage containers must not exceed 125 litres (33 gallons) in size and must have two open, rigid handles and a removable lid.

- Maximum weight per garbage bag or container is 22 kg (50 lbs).
- Garbage bags placed at the curb must be securely tied.
- Loose material must be contained in securely tied bags within containers.
- Do not use ties or bungee cords to secure lids on containers.
- Sharp items such as broken glass, ceramics and mirrors should be placed separately in a cardboard box that is safely secured and clearly labelled "broken glass".

Electronic Waste (E-waste) items are NOT collected at the curb and should not be thrown in the garbage as they contain valuable resources and hazardous materials that need to be recycled and disposed of properly. E-waste can be taken to select York Region waste depots (see page 13). Limits apply.











Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

is anything in your home that is corrosive, explosive, flammable or poisonous and must be disposed of properly. Residents can drop off household hazardous waste at select York Region waste depots (see page 13 for details). Limits apply.





















METAL & LARGE ITEM COLLECTION



Large (Bulky) Items:

- Items such as furniture, mattresses, box springs, office chairs and other large items can be placed curbside for collection on your scheduled garbage collection day provided a large item tag has been attached to each item.
- Large item tags are available for purchase at most Town facilities (see page 1 for a list of locations).



Large Metal Items:

- Large metal items such as appliances, BBQ's (no propane tanks), metal bath tubs, bicycles and other large metal items are collected by appointment only and require a large item tag.
- To arrange for curbside collection, residents must first purchase a large item tag and then call GFL (Green for Life) at 1-866-421-5625. If a special collection is not booked, metal items will not be collected.
- For safety reasons, please remove doors from fridges, freezers, dishwashers and ovens.



Additional Information:

Bulky items, appliances, large metal items and scrap metal can be dropped off at select York Region waste depots for disposal (fees may apply – see page 3 for details).



Toilets

Toilets (with tank and bowl drained and separated) can be placed curbside on your scheduled garbage collection day as one item towards the three item limit.



Carpet and Linoleum

Carpet and linoleum can be placed curbside on your scheduled garbage collection day provided it is cut up and securely tied in bundles weighing less than 22 kg (50 lbs) each and measuring no longer than 1.5 m (4 ft.). Each bundle counts as one item towards the three item limit.



Renovation Waste


Renovation waste such as concrete, drywall, wood, doors, windows, etc. is not collected curbside.

These materials can be taken to select York Region waste depots for proper disposal (see page 3) or donate good quality materials to a charitable organization.




