TAKE CAUTION AROUND LAKES, STREAMS, RIVERS AND STORMWATER PONDS

Take caution around local bodies of water such as Fairy Lake, the Holland River and storm water ponds. Use extreme caution and advise your children not to play, fish, swim or toboggan in these areas. Stormwater ponds may look safe but water flow and levels can fluctuate quickly without warning.

PHASE 2: WATER METER REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

We are moving onto the second phase of the Mandatory Water Meter Replacement Program that will see water meters replaced for approximately 18,000 households. This work will be done on an area-by-area basis. Those selected will receive a letter in the mail to book an appointment for an in-house water meter exchange with the Town's contractor WAMCO. An adult 18+ years old is required to be home for the duration of the appointment.

BE A GOOD NEIGHBOUR. KEEP YOUR PETS ON A LEASH AND PICK UP AFTER THEM

All pets must be leashed at all times when on public property except when at the Newmarket Off-leash Dog Park. Please be courteous as not everyone is comfortable with dogs. Please also remember to bring waste bags to pick-up after your pet and dispose of the waste in waste receptacles.

SHARE NEWMARKET TRAILS: USE SAFE SPEEDS

Cyclists are reminded to use safe speeds when travelling along the trails. What feels safe to you may not to others. Watch out for families and small children, use your best judgement and be mindful of others. Help keep the trails safe and enjoyable for all.

SIGN-UP FOR A FREE BURLAP KIT TO MANAGE SPONGY MOTHS

There are a few weekends left to sign-up to pick-up a free burlap kit to help manage Spongy Moths (LDD moths) this season. Once you have signed up and selected your desired date and time, kits can be picked up at the Operations Centre (1275 Maple Hill Court). Installing burlap bands on trees will act as a barrier for Spongy Moth caterpillars from eating the tree's leaves. Burlap installation is the most effective when installed in early May.
