TAKE EXTRA CAUTION AROUND LAKES, STREAMS, RIVERS AND STORMWATER PONDS

Take caution around local bodies of water such as Fairy Lake, the Holland River and storm water ponds. Use extreme caution and advise your children to not to skate, fish, swim or toboggan in these areas. Stormwater ponds may look safe but water flow and levels can fluctuate quickly without warning.

WINTER DRIVING SAFETY TIPS

Be safety driven. Follow these winter driving safety tips:

- Install winter tires
- Take time to clear ice and snow from exterior windows and mirrors
- Give yourself extra time to travel to your destination; drive according to the weather
- Leave extra distance between your vehicle and the one in front of you
- Keep an emergency kit in your car (include water, food that will not spoil, first aid kit, small shovel, whistle, jumper cables, etc.)
