Take caution around local bodies of water such as Fairy Lake, the Holland River and stormwater ponds. Use extreme caution and advise your children to not skate, fish, swim or toboggan in these areas. Stormwater ponds may look safe but water flow and levels can fluctuate quickly without warning. Please do not skate on stormwater ponds.
