#### PRIVATE TREE REMOVAL PERMIT

As of **July 1**, 2022, property owners looking to remove a tree on private property are required to obtain a permit in accordance with the Town's Private Tree Protection By-law and pay the appropriate fees and charges associated with the removal. There are no fees for trees that are dead, dying, or hazardous, however a permit must still be obtained to remove the tree.
